Chairs Report

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2019 Year

A year of change for Squash in Canterbury. I stepped down as chair late in the year, as required by Squash NZ rules to be part of the Squash NZ board. Also, the resignation of Karen Boag our administrator for the last 3 years. There have also been several new faces around the board table. All of this is positive as Squash Canterbury is now well poised to make further advances on the gains made over the last few years. I trust that the Squash community gives the new board the same great support as we have received in the past.



It was great to have a new 8 court complex opened by the Christchurch Squash Club mid-year. This now gives Christchurch one of the premiere squash facilities in New Zealand and we all need to get behind them to ensure these facilities are well used and do attract major events to Christchurch. Experience has shown that a highly successful club benefits other clubs in the area, so there is an opportunity for all clubs to benefit. New courts at Richmond Workingmen's club are still in the pipeline but not yet confirmed.

While there were changes happening, the board is still very happy with our achievements over the year. The objectives it set out to achieve at the beginning of the year were achieved and has kept the sport moving in the right direction. I would like to make special mention of the work being undertaken by our Junior Development Officer (Di McCoy). She has worked extremely hard and successfully in getting many more juniors engaged in our sport. Details of this are later in the report.

Financially we have once again managed to operate at a surplus. This is becoming more difficult as the funding requirements are becoming more restrictive, especially around our representative teams. Going forward we will need to be looking a new and different ways to obtain funding, especially in supporting our representative teams as this is a major cost.

One of the major challenges our sport (along with others) faces going forward is the attraction and retention of players to the game. New people being introduced is key for the future of the sport and currently while we are static in numbers we are not increasing at the same level as population growth. There is no magic wand here, but I do encourage clubs to work together, with Squash Canterbury, to look at new and innovative ways for getting more people playing. We may need to cast aside thinking only of our individual club and look at things through a wider plane.

I would like to pass on our sincere thanks to all the volunteers at all levels of our sport. Without you our game wouldn't exist. Please do keep it up and find ways to encourage others to get involved too.

I would also like to make a special mention and thanks to Karen Boag who resigned in December. Karen came into the position at a difficult time and has been hugely instrumental in lifting the performance of Squash Canterbury and providing significant support to the board, clubs, teams and individuals. Thanks for your dedication, time and significant effort Karen.

2020 going to be another busy year and we look forward to working with our clubs and members to achieve the outcomes we all strive for.

Coach Development: Key Outcomes

In 2019 we delivered **2** Squash NZ Coach Development modules, both in the top of the South Island.

The modules delivered:

Feb & March – How to Coach.

Squash New Zealand are working on a new Coaching Framework, it is expected to be released in April 2020, so the decision was made to put on hold delivering further modules and align to the new framework once released. A total of 11 people attended.

Coach Development and Mentoring Programme – a new initiative

This programme focused on the practical aspects of coaching and was structured to support existing coaches working in Junior programmes. As a pilot programme it was offered to 5 Canterbury coaches with each coach having 4 sessions with our mentor.

Rod Hayes Coaching Workshop – a new initiative

This workshop is aimed at teaching good hitting techniques, also recognise common errors and techniques for correcting them. Open to coaches working in Junior programmes.

The Canterbury Open was hosted by Burnside Squash club this year and was a great affair, with



nearly all of Canterbury's top players converging on the scene. Whilst the majority of the games were played at Burnside, the sheer number of entries at 160 people (122 men, 30 women, and 8 juniors) meant that Hoon Hay and Squashways got the tap on the shoulder to help with the overflow. This year's event was an increase of 60 entries overall mainly due to strong entries from out of town.

Big congratulations to the Men's and Women's Open winners, Oliver Johnston and Emma Cormack, who defended their titles in dominating style. Defending a title of such stature is never easy, but neither of them looked in doubt of doing so.

Pay2Play at Squash HQ

Pay2Play was launched at Squash HQ in the middle of October 2018, as a trial to see how we can make squash facilities available to more people and after completing the transition for the Hoon Hay Squash Club members onto using the new system, 2019 was the year for encouraging casual non-member usage.

Pay2Play is a secure cost-effective online booking, payment and access solution for Sports Facilities. There is no need to be a Member. Players can simply book and pay for a Squash Court. The system allows members to have their own personal key code which can be activated or deactivated at the click of a button by the facility administrator. Casual non-members can book a court and pay online. They receive a one-use door access code along with information on how to find Squash HQ and a list of instructions. The installation included hardware which controls the court lights from the booking system.

Squash HQ was utilised for a wide variety of uses in 2019, including competitions, trainings, coaching clinics, meetings, tournaments, events and of course casual use – all facilitated by the Pay2Play system. Highlights of the year included the hosting of the Junior 2100 #3, the Canterbury Junior Open, and the Canterbury Open, which exposed hundreds of people to this new initiative at the facility. Usage per month peaked for the year in June with 2202 uses, while the total number of uses for the year was 18,979.

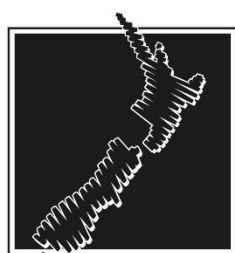
