#### **Participation Activator - Marlborough**

Squash Canterbury was delighted to be granted funding from the Pelorus Trust to employ a Participation Activator in Marlborough for 5 hours per week, and we would like to welcome Julie Brown to the role. Check out Julie's introduction:

"Hi I'm Julie Brown (nee Gillaly), and I have recently been appointed in a new role as a participation activator for the Marlborough Region. I am a competitive squash player and have been around for some time, moving my way up the country and back down again to Blenheim where I have recently relocated with my young family. I have two children, Jacob (2) and Sophie (4) who love being down at the squash courts running around and generally causing chaos. My husband Dave also picked up a racket after getting bored being dragged around tournaments each weekend as a spectator! I started off playing as a junior in my hometown of Alexandra and have spent the last ten years or so up in Auckland. I have been



fortunate enough over the years to have represented the Otago, Wellington, and Auckland districts and love both the competitive and social aspects which the game offers.

I am hugely passionate about growing the sport as a whole and spreading the squash bug to anyone that I can push onto a court. As a school teacher, I also have a keen interest in developing junior squash and have been busy of late setting up a 'Have a Hit' programme for new junior players in Blenheim. We currently have around 25 keen kids attending the programme each week and learning our beautiful game. An under 900 series is in the pipelines and a focus on promoting our Marlborough Junior Open. This round I have been coordinating our Winter Interclub and have plans of implementing further initiatives to provide opportunities for new senior and masters players in the area. I look forward to meeting you all around the

tournament scene this year."

#### **Participation Activator – West Coast**

Squash Canterbury is also excited to finally be able to share that through the Tu Manawa Active Aotearoa Fund, and in collaboration with Southern Zone Rugby League, Touch Canterbury, KiwiTag and Ki-O-Rahi, funding was received to appoint a combined Participation Activator role for these sports on the West Coast. He is also trying to get to club nights to meet the different people playing squash and learning more about our great sport.

It's very exciting to have dedicated resource to growing the sport of squash, and we look forward to supporting Ryan, Julie and Michael in their initiatives and endeavours!

Other contenders for this award were the other winners in the categories, including Olivia Merry (sportswoman), Crusaders (team), Peter Fulton (coach), Gareth Greenfield (official) and Sophie Pascoe (para athlete/team).

It was an amazing moment for Paul, his family, the Greymouth Squash Club, the wider

Squash Canterbury and Squash New Zealand communities when Paul was then announced as the Supreme Sportsperson of the Year award. It is a phenomenal achievement to see squash being recognised against other bigger and more highly resourced sports, and it is a testament to Paul and his hard work throughout his career that he is being acknowledged for his efforts with these accolades.

It capped off a big week for Paul, who was runner up at the PSA World Tour Platinum Event at the El Gouna International Squash Open in Egypt, going down 0-3 in the final to Mohamed



ElShorbagy. Paul's parents, Mike and Julie Coll, were on hand at the awards ceremony at Hagley Oval to receive the awards on Paul's behalf.
