## **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

At the beginning of 2014, we welcomed the "Top of the South" (TOTS) clubs into the Squash Canterbury fold. It has been exciting having them on board for over a year now. We have implemented a junior coaching programme in these clubs, with our district coach, Mike Allred, doing a fabulous job of visiting the TOTS area several times during the year to ensure that our development and high performance squads are in place.

It was wonderful to see the TOTS clubs well represented at our awards night towards the end of the year, and their prowess revealed itself in the number of awards that they won.

Participation remains the number one focus for the board. Much of our day to day work at Squash Canterbury involves activities such as interclub and tournaments. Whilst these are essential, they largely cater to existing players rather than attracting new players to the game. To this end, Squash Canterbury is pleased to have secured the services of Matter of Sport, and in particular, Jenn Halliday, as our Strategic Manager. Jenn started in this role at the beginning of 2015, and will focus on our long term strategic goals, with an emphasis on increasing participation. Jenn's role has been fully funded by the generous assistance of the New Zealand Community Trust, and we are very thankful for their support.

Four years have now passed since our major earthquakes, and our rebuild projects are still in the design/funding stages. Sumner's new facility requires additional funding, and the Christchurch Squash Club rebuild is still working through options and design. It appears that squash will not be included in the Metro Sports Complex, although that project has been set back several years in the rebuild priorities.

Thanks to our office Manager, Kim Paviell, we have seen a big turnaround in our financial performance during 2014. Despite posting a small operating loss, we are well on our way back to a strong financial position, after a disappointing performance in 2013. With funding increasingly difficult to obtain, this is an excellent result.

As always, a very big thank you to all of our volunteers. Sport cannot survive without you. Club presidents and committees, selectors, coaches, convenors, and referees, all deserve sincere thanks for their efforts.

Thanks too to the board. All board members are volunteers, and the work put in by all members is excellent. Mary Turnbull is standing down after four years. Mary has provided valuable insights into the needs of juniors, being the only board member who currently has a child player in our junior ranks. Thank you Mary for all your contributions. To the rest of the board, Jeanette Beatty, Michael Taylor, and Pat Barwick, thank you too for your ongoing contributions. I am up against stiff competition in my quest for another two year term, so I can't guarantee that I will be back with you this year. Nevertheless, I'm sure that the vast experience and expertise of our board members will see Squash Canterbury continue to perform well.

## Senior Report

### CANTERBURY SENIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR - PAUL COLL

Paul made his debut this year representing New Zealand at the Commonwealth Games in singles, doubles and mixed doubles. He made it through to the quarter finals in doubles after beating the current number 1 New Zealand pairing. He matched his seeding finishing third at the New Zealand Senior Nationals and was a member of the Canterbury Senior team that finished third at Nationals

Paul won the Australia Day Tournament, was second at the City of Perth Open, and made a number of semi-finals. He led Squashways to win the Cousins Shield title, the first club in Canterbury to ever win the title. Paul made time to play the local interclub competition this year, which was great for the spectators. His team also won the Division 1. Paul based himself in Holland and Europe last summer to play their National league and to train with the best players in the world. He is currently the number one male Canterbury player, number three in New Zealand, and number 83 in the world.

Adam achieved a last 16 finish, Jackson lost in second round of plate and Matt losing in semi-final of Consolation Plate. All players had 3-4 games within a span of 48 hours with no major injuries which gave us confidence to challenge for a high placing/winning the team's event.

After finishing second last year we were confident of finishing higher. Our first rubber was against Central we won 3/1. The only loss was Jackson who had a very hard 4 setter against Jason van der Walt who played way higher than his seeding in individuals. Second game was against 3<sup>rd</sup> seed Auckland. We were confident of winning top 2 places and were all about winning /getting valuable games at 3/4. Paul won 3/0, Chris 3/2 but Adam and Jackson were unable to secure games both losing 3/0. The experience these players learnt from their games will serve them well in future Nationals. Auckland was just too good on the day. Third game

3/4 play off. After Matt Smith won in 5 we quickly secured wins at 1/2 hence beat BOP 3/0 to secure final third placing from 7 districts.

The women's team was quite young perhaps, in comparison to teams sent in previous years, but they certainly did Canterbury proud in the way they conducted themselves on and off the court and would have gained a lot of experience for future years. The proudest moment for Canterbury would have to go to Megan Craig, for winning the national individual womens title. While the win did not happen in the way anyone would have wanted, with Joelle suffering a serious Achilles tendon injury in the second game, we shouldn't let that take too much away from her achievement. Her spot in the final was well earned and she pushed Joelle hard in the first game, losing 11-9. The crowd was treated to some world class womens squash before Joelle retired injured in the second game when Megan was 3-1 up. Eliza Sim also had a successful individual tournament, finishing 9<sup>th</sup> place overall, and winning the special plate.

Canterbury women were seeded 2<sup>nd</sup> in the teams event but looking at the teams points, there was little between the top 4. We beat 7<sup>th</sup> seed Wellington comfortably 4-0 and faced a young, but very determined Central team the same afternoon. This was the toughest tie of the weekend with two of the players in the central team having represented NZ at World junior champs and another currently in the NZ world juniors squad. Sophie O'Connell and Eliza Sim both battled hard, but lost their matches 3-1 to Kaitlin Watts and Danielle Fourie respectively. Megan Craig defeated number 1 Rebecca Barnett and so it came down to the last match which Emma Sim needed to win in four to win outright or five for points countback. Emma gave it all making for an exciting battle which could have gone either way, but her opponent Jackie Tapp took the 5<sup>th</sup> game 11-8. 3<sup>rd</sup> seeded Central then went onto defeat Auckland in the final.

Finals on Sunday were tough after a week of hard squash, and this was their 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> match of the weekend, so it was pleasing to see Sophie O'Connell start the team off with a 3-2 win over Nicola Blake coming back from 2-1 down. Eliza Sim followed suit, battling hard against Lassie Cull to win 3-2. Megan got the third game comfortably against Alana Sincock 3-0, and Emma Sim followed suit, defeating Jacinta Matson 3-1 to take a 4-0 win over Waikato for third place overall.

Special mention also to Kelsi Carrick who came along as our reserve at short notice after Awhina Tapiata withdrew due to injury. Kelsi competed well in individuals Div 1 and although she did not get to play teams event, I'm sure she will have gained a lot from the experience and Canterbury will benefit from that in the future.
